- 2) Is it fair to everyone?
- 3) Will it build goodwill and better friendships?
- 4) Will it be beneficial to all concerned?

And, your speech must have solid organization and be between 5 and 7 minutes in length. An outline/summary will be required in Frau's hands/computer by Friday, January 22nd 2021, sundown. An official contest application/mini- biography must be submitted by Friday, January 29th, 2021.

✓ **Topics may include**: Heartbreak, Love, Bamboozled, Defeating, Success, Mother Earth, On the Field, Embarrassed, Caught in the Act, Meditation/Relaxation in School, Should Graffiti be considered Art, Your own idea, and these should always be
