Blood Drive	Heather Reynolds	Our annual blood drive will be on 12/1 starting at 1pm. The Red Cross will order tables and chairs from a vendor to have them delivered to the room so they're already ready to go. Book Fair	Emily Kiernan, Catherine DeLorenzo & Divya Cyril	The Book Fair kicked off on Friday, September 22nd combined with the Family Fun event, the Book Lover's Ball and Costume Competition. All together, the evening generated \$4,950 in book fair sales, but book sales were down from last year's launch night sales of \$7,331. The Book Fair has been going very well, with most students shopping during their library class. Mr. John Laricella's \$5000 donation on behalf of his late wife Cathy, a former Cold Spring employee who loved to read, has ensured every child at Cold Spring has had the opportunity to purchase at least one book at the Fair. The Cathy Dollars have impacted our student population positively because there have been many happy students who have spent their \$10 Cathy Dollars and participated in the Book Fair at a 100% student participation level. The Fair will close at school at the end of the day on Monday, October 2nd, and then remain open for online sales until October 5th during which time the School still earns Scholastic Points. The Book Fair committee has 2 weeks to work with our Scholastic Representative to officially complete the close out of our Fair. Many students are using the eWallet digital payment system, we had a lower number of parents create eWallets for students this year, and funding overall was lower. It is recommended that giving 2 weeks notice and communication of this program helps its success.

ROAR-A-T HON	Catherine DeLoernzo and Divya Cyril	The HSA ROAR-a-Thon ran from the Kickoff Assembly on Friday, Sept 8th to the Fun Run on Friday, Sept 15th. It was a comprehensive flat donation type fundraiser that had student leadership lessons, assembly excitement and a Fun Run to cap the whole experience for the student body. To date, the community has donated \$20,351. The online donation site Gives Signup will remain open until October 31, 2023. Our program used prizes as an incentive, but really tried to focus on what all the kids were learning from this comprehensive program - ROAR lessons, leadership, mentoring and a positive Fun Run experience with t-shirt and medal. All students received a free t-shirt and a participation ROARmedal which were well received by students! All staff also received a free t-shirt and appreciated being included and definitely represented CS on Fun Run day. After our operating costs of t-shirts, medals, popsicles, DJ, and the Midway Fire Department donation, which amounted to \$5248.20, the ROAR-a-Thon raised the HSA \$15,103. The majority (68%) donated around \$25-\$50. It was not a compulsory fee or registration for each child.
